G. RESEARCH

1. Research Activities: Summary of research and its impact

My program of research focuses on examining the role of cancer information, patient information needs and preferences, and survivorship needs and their roles in optimizing psychosocial adjustment to cancer and health care service use. In addition, I test the effects of innovative and accessible psychosocial oncology interventions in meeting individuals' multidimensional needs (i.e., physical, psychological, instrumental, social, spiritual, and financial). I specifically investigate the effects of e-health and m-health (mobile) interventions using multimedia technology on various health-related outcomes such as quality of life, empowerment, self-regulation and patterns of health care service utilization by individuals affected by cancer.

My ongoing research program has been transdisciplinary and international in scope as attested by my publication record in multidisciplinary international journals (e.g., journals in the U.S., Brazil, Canada, England, Peru and India) and the involvement of numerous multicultural research trainees and collaborators from Africa, France, India, and the U.S. In 2009, 2010, and 2014, I received several awards including "Award of Excellence in Medical Research" from the Lady Davis Institute in Montréal, a book prize from the QC's ministry of education, the Canadian Association of Psychosocial Oncology (CAPO) Award for Excellence in Education and Training and I was nominated by the American Association of Psychosocial Oncology (APOS) for an award of Excellence in Education, and the Bronfman Award of Excellence for teaching and mentorship from the McGill Department of Oncology. Two papers co-authored by my graduate students and I won "Best Scientific Paper of the Year" in the top ranking U.S. nursing journals.

The impact and timeliness of my program of research have been recognized and supported through various means including sustained career scientist awards from FRQ-S, large-scale operating grants to conduct a pan-Canadian randomized trial (CIHR-funded) and an implementation study in bone health and breast cancer (QBCF). I have received research funding in the form of operating grants since 2003 from various agencies such as the CIHR, NCIC, FRQ-S, SSHRC, CPAC, the Indo-Canadian Shastri Foundation, and GRIISIQ, as well as hospitals and the university, totaling over \$43 million. Of this amount, more than \$9 million was obtained as Principal Investigator with an additional \$486,379 received as peer-reviewed salary support. Since being tenured, I have continued to actively disseminate my work through scientific publications, book chapters and reports with 141 published to date. As Principal Investigator for a CIHR/Strategic Training Initiative in Health Research (STIHR) called PORT (Psychosocial Oncology Research Training, Loiselle et al., 2003-2009 and 2009-2017), I have been granted \$4 million to support the training of promising graduate students in the field of psychosocial oncology – a program that is unique in the world. PORT included over 40 accomplished researchers/mentors and 75 high caliber trainees from over a dozen of health-related disciplines.

Following a rigorous international search, I was appointed in 2011 and then reappointed in 2016 as the Christine and Herschel Victor Research Chair in Psychosocial Oncology (2011-2021). This appointment is a testament to my being recognized as a researcher of international caliber, not only in the field of oncology nursing but also in the broader multidisciplinary field of

psychosocial oncology. My leadership and contributions to cancer research have been recognized nationally and internationally with requests to act as grant reviewer for various agencies (e.g., in Canada, the U.S., U.K., France, Ireland, and the Netherlands), to deliver keynotes to various groups of scholars, professional groups and government agencies (e.g., Faculty of Medicine, National Institute of Mental Health & Neurosciences, Bangalore, India; Order of Nurses of Quebec, British Columbia Cancer Agency, Quebec's Programme de lutte contre le cancer).
